A Zoning Certificate shall be obtained from the Zoning Officer before any person may:

CODES!

ZONING &

Occupy or use any vacant land or structure; or Change the use of a structure or land to a different use; or Construct, reconstruct, move, alter, or enlarge any structure or building; or Change a nonconforming use.

Improvements to land, preliminary to any use of such land, shall not commence prior to the issuance of the zoning certificate.

New Businesses must contact the borough office prior to opening, making any changes or improvements. A business Privilege license and tax is required.

Please report streetlights that are not working to the Borough Office Collect waste from your dogs in parks and on property.

REMINDER

Make sure you have large/visible street numbers on the front of your house so police/fire/ambulance crews can easily find you in an emergency. Trash must be kept in watertight, leak proof, insect/ rodent proof containers with tight fitting lids or covers.



Check to make sure your carbon monoxide and smoke detectors are working


If your sidewalk is damaged please fix it before someone falls. You are liable for any injuries to pedestrians.

Snow Removal

No person owning, controlling or occupying any lot, ground or premises adjoining or fronting any of the streets or alleys in the borough shall permit snow or ice to accumulate or remain upon the pavements, sidewalks or walkways in front of or adjoining such lot, ground or premises, for a longer period than 24 hours after it has stopped snowing or after the accumulation of ice thereon.
