Earned Income & Local Service Tax

The Earned Income and the Local Service Tax is collected by the Waynesburg Borough appointed collector, for more information please contact:

Earned Income Tax: 1%

The Earned Income Tax for Waynesburg Borough is a 1% tax levied on the

earned income. This tax is a nondiscriminatory tax applying to gross compensation and or net profit which is commonly referred to a "Wage Tax" levied against an individual's earned income and or net profits whether the income is from the operation of a business or from wages, commission or other sources.

Local Service Tax: (LST) \$52

Formerly the Emergency and Municipal Service Tax. (EMST)

The Local Service Tax is a \$52.00 tax levied on all residents and nonresidents who hold an occupation in Waynesburg Borough. Persons who earn less than \$12,000.00 per year are exempt from the tax upon filing of an affidavit with their employer that they anticipate earnings less than such stated amount due to seasonal employment or otherwise.

Employee Withholding:

All employers in Waynesburg Borough are required to deduct the Tax from their employees' pay beginning with the first payroll period in which the person is engaging in an occupation

The pro rata shares of the tax assessed for a payroll period shall be determined

by dividing \$52.00, the rate of the Local Service Tax, by the number of payroll periods established by the employer for the calendar year. If an employee has 26 pay periods in a year, \$2.00 shall be deducted per paycheck (\$52.00 divided by 26 pay periods = \$2.00 deducted per pay).

Refunds:

Claims for any Local Service Tax paid by any person eligible for exemption must be processed through our collector, Keystone Collections Group.

ZONING & CODES!

A Zoning Certificate shall be obtained from the Zoning Officer before any person may:

Occupy or use any vacant land or structure; or Change the use of a structure or land to a different use; or Construct, reconstruct, move, alter, or enlarge any structure or building; or Change a nonconforming use.

Improvements to land, preliminary to any use of such land, shall not commence prior to the issuance of the zoning certificate.

New Businesses must contact the borough office prior to opening, making any changes or improvements. A business Privilege license and tax is required.



Charles "Pye" Plasko

Pye's Greene County Weather

Charles "Pyc" Plasko grew up in Greene County and spent most of his 73 years of life here. He currently resides in Myrtle Beach where him and his wife Kathy enjoy golfing, shopping, dining, and "the weather". He attended high school at Carmichaels Area and went on to college at California State University where he earned his master's degree in Earth Sciences in 1988.

His love or addiction to the weather began while he attended grade school in Nemacolin. He apparently hated going to school. And they had to walk there in all types of weather nonetheless, so he would follow the weather forecasts from TV and draw his own weather maps that showed where the storms (especially snow storms) were located. From that he would know when they had the chance for school to be cancelled, snow days, yay. He became so disappointed when things didn't work out. Why didn't it snow when the TV weatherman said it was going to? That's what he wanted to know, That's what drove his curiosity, the desire to know "what happened"?? For the next 33 years he taught Earth Science and a few other classes at CAHS. Of course, Meteorology being part of Earth Science was his favorite unit of instruction.

After retirement from teaching in 2007 Pye ended up as a Realtor, selling homes for Coldwell Banker, Pittsburgh, where he had to travel all over Southwestern Pennsylvania. He soon realized that the weather forecasts from the local TV channels were not always accurate, and sometimes way off base. So, he kept thinking about doing his own research, writing his own forecasts for Greene County and posting them on Facebook. Thus was the creation of **Pye's Greene County Weather** (**PGCWx**) on Veterans Day 2012. Now, almost 13 years later Pye has 16,207 followers as of this writing and going strong. He stated that he is "overwhelmed to say the least and very appreciative for those who follow along".

Pye stated that "It has been a very rewarding and fun experience, writing a forecast for the folks of Greene County and now Washington County and Fayette County (lowlands) have joined in". Pye has followers from all over the place, including other states where former residents want to just see what's going on here, in good ol' Greene County. Pye said he "will keep moving forward as long as the good Lord is willing.". The Special Events Commission of Waynesburg Borough is proud to announce the establishment of a new award in honor of the late Timothy M. Hawfield.

Chief Hawfield: First Responder Service with Honor Award

Timothy "Chief" Hawfield was more than just a name in Waynesburg—he was a cornerstone of the community whose influence continues to resonate today. Through his distinguished career as a police officer and his unwavering commitment to community service and volunteerism, he touched the lives of countless individuals.



Tim's journey in law enforcement began in June 1979 when he joined the Waynesburg Borough Police Department. By May 1981, he had earned the title of chief of police, a position he held with pride and dedication for 32 years. During his tenure, Tim's contributions didn't go unnoticed; he earned numerous awards and citations, and one of his proudest achievements was his pivotal role in promoting the "Officer Phil" child safety program in local elementary schools.

But his impact didn't stop there. Tim was an Eagle Scout, a former scoutmaster for Troop 1289, district chairman, and a member of the Eagle Scout Board of Review. He also made his mark as a Little League baseball coach and as an "American Policing" instructor at Waynesburg College. A Civil War enthusiast, Tim was always ready to share his passion and knowledge with anyone eager to listen. He even founded the beloved "Husband Calling Contest" at the annual Rain Day Festival, which he found highly entertaining.

In 2013, Tim received the Waynesburg Chamber of Commerce Distinguished Service Award, a fitting tribute to his lifetime of dedication. A 2020 recipient of the Jack McCracken Award, Tim was also deeply involved in numerous organizations He was an active member of the Fraternal Order of Police, Salvation Army, and First Baptist Church of Waynesburg. His community work extended to roles with the Western PA Chiefs of Police Association, the PA Safe Kids Coalition, the Greene County Drug Task Force, and many other local initiatives focused on youth, wellness, and safety.

Above all, Tim was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather, whose love for his family knew no bounds. He was a loyal brother, a cherished friend, and a mentor to many. His legacy lives on through the countless lives he touched and the community he helped shape.

*Documentation must be provided of Employment/Volunteer Status within Greene County


