ZONING & CODES!

A Zoning Certificate shall be obtained from the Zoning Officer before any person may:

- Occupy or use any vacant land or structure; or
- Change the use of a structure or land to a different use; or
- Construct, reconstruct, move, alter, or enlarge any structure or building; or
- Change a nonconforming use.

Improvements to land, preliminary to any use of such land, shall not commence prior to the issuance of the zoning certificate.

New Businesses must contact the borough office prior to opening, making any changes or improvements. A business Privilege license and tax is required.

Spring into Action

Disasters are becoming more frequent and more intense, and the need for blood products remains constant. Every day, people just like you help ensure the Red Cross can respond when communities need us most. - VA Hospital Volunteers: Support veterans through visits and activities.
- Volunteers & Recruiters: Office support and community outreach.

Home Administrative Fires: Fast Facts

- You can protect yourself from home fires by taking two simple steps: Test your smoke alarms monthly and practice your fire escape plan.
- Working smoke alarms can cut the risk of dying in a home fire by half.
- Every second counts during a home fire as you have just two minutes to escape safely.
- The Red Cross responds to about 65,000 disasters a year — and the majority are home fires.

Preparedness Tips

- To create your home fire escape plan, include at least two ways to exit every room in your home. Select a meeting spot at a safe distance away from your home, such as your neighbor's home or landmark like a specific tree in your front yard, where everyone knows to meet.
- Take time to discuss the plan with everyone in your household and practice it twice a year.
- While practicing your escape plan, teach children what a smoke alarm sounds like. Talk about fire safety and what to do in an emergency.
- Place smoke alarms on each level of your home, including inside and outside bedrooms and sleeping areas. Test your smoke alarms once a month.

What to Do if You Have a Home Fire



1 Alert Your Family

Yell "fire" as loud as you can.



2 Never Open Warm Doors

Instead, use a second escape route.



3 Designate a Caller

Someone should call 911 once at your family's meeting place.



4 Prepare Now

Practice your escape plan with your family at least twice a year.



5 Install & Test Smoke Alarms

Make sure your home has working smoke alarms.

REMINDERS

If your sidewalk is damaged, please fix it. You are liable for any injuries to pedestrians.

Make sure you have large/visible street numbers on the front of your house so police/fire/ambulance crews can easily find you in an emergency.

Collect waste from your dogs in parks and on property.

Check to make sure your carbon monoxide and smoke detectors are working

Trash must be kept in watertight, leak proof, insect/ rodent proof containers with tight fitting lids or covers.

No burning. Fires are allowed with outdoor cooking, must be appropriate size.

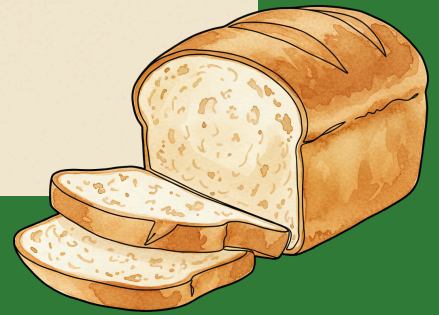

Kick off spring with a weekend of hiking, camping, and community in the beautiful countryside of Greene County, Pennsylvania on April 10-12, 2026. This relaxed outdoor gathering invites participants to slow down, connect with fellow adventurers, and enjoy time outside.

The three-day, two-night experience will take place about 30 minutes from Hilltop Packs, with the exact location shared with registered participants. Hikers will follow a clearly marked 1.5-mile scenic trail across private property (with permission) to a campsite known as “The Hill.” The weekend is designed to be flexible—arrive and head out whenever it fits your schedule. Firewood and water will be provided at the campsite, so just bring your camping gear, food, and a chair for relaxing around the fire.

On Sunday morning, wrap up the weekend with a free coffee at RGB Coffee on your way home. Registration is just \$5 per person, and the fee will be covered by Hilltop Packs for anyone who preregisters—making the event free to attend.

Parking at the trailhead is limited, so carpooling is encouraged, and some vehicles may be left at Hilltop Packs. Whether you’re a seasoned backpacker or simply looking to meet new people and enjoy the outdoors, this laid-back weekend under the stars is the perfect way to welcome the new season.

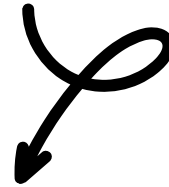

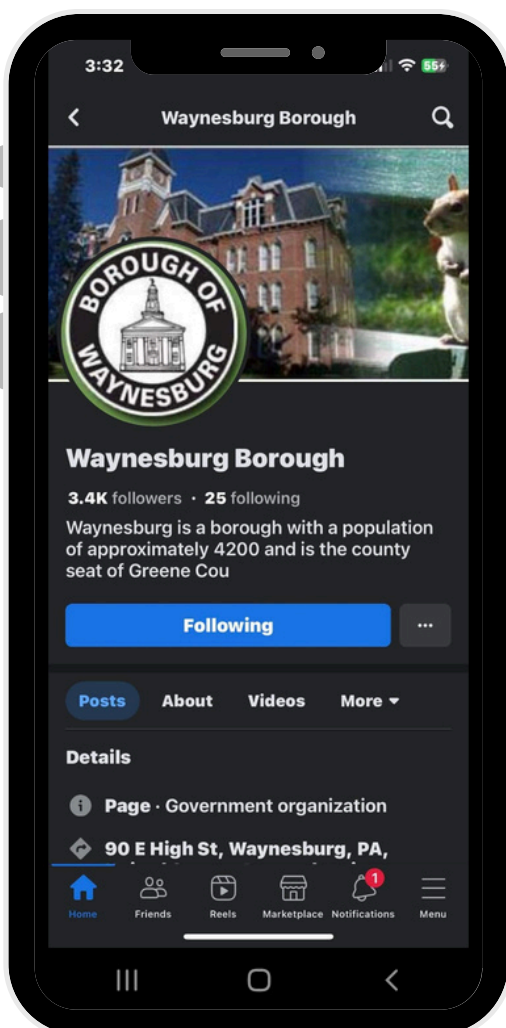
